

# PAPER KERERŪ DIRECTIONS

## (1) COLLECT YOUR TOOLS:

Scissors, fine string, glue, water, plastic lid to use to mix glue & water, brush. Optional: white pen or paint.

(1A) OPTIONAL: Use white pen or paint to paint in the white highlight on the red paper eyes.

## (2) PRINT & CUT OUT EVERYTHING.

## (3) MAKE STRING LOOPS:

Cut lengths of fine string to 23cm. Tie into loops

## (4) MIX GLUE:

On the old plastic lid, using an old paint brush, mix two parts white glue with one part water.

You don't need much!

## (5) GLUE HEADS & BODIES:

Glue green heads and bodies to white chest. Glue reverse heads & bodies to the other side of the bird. Let dry.

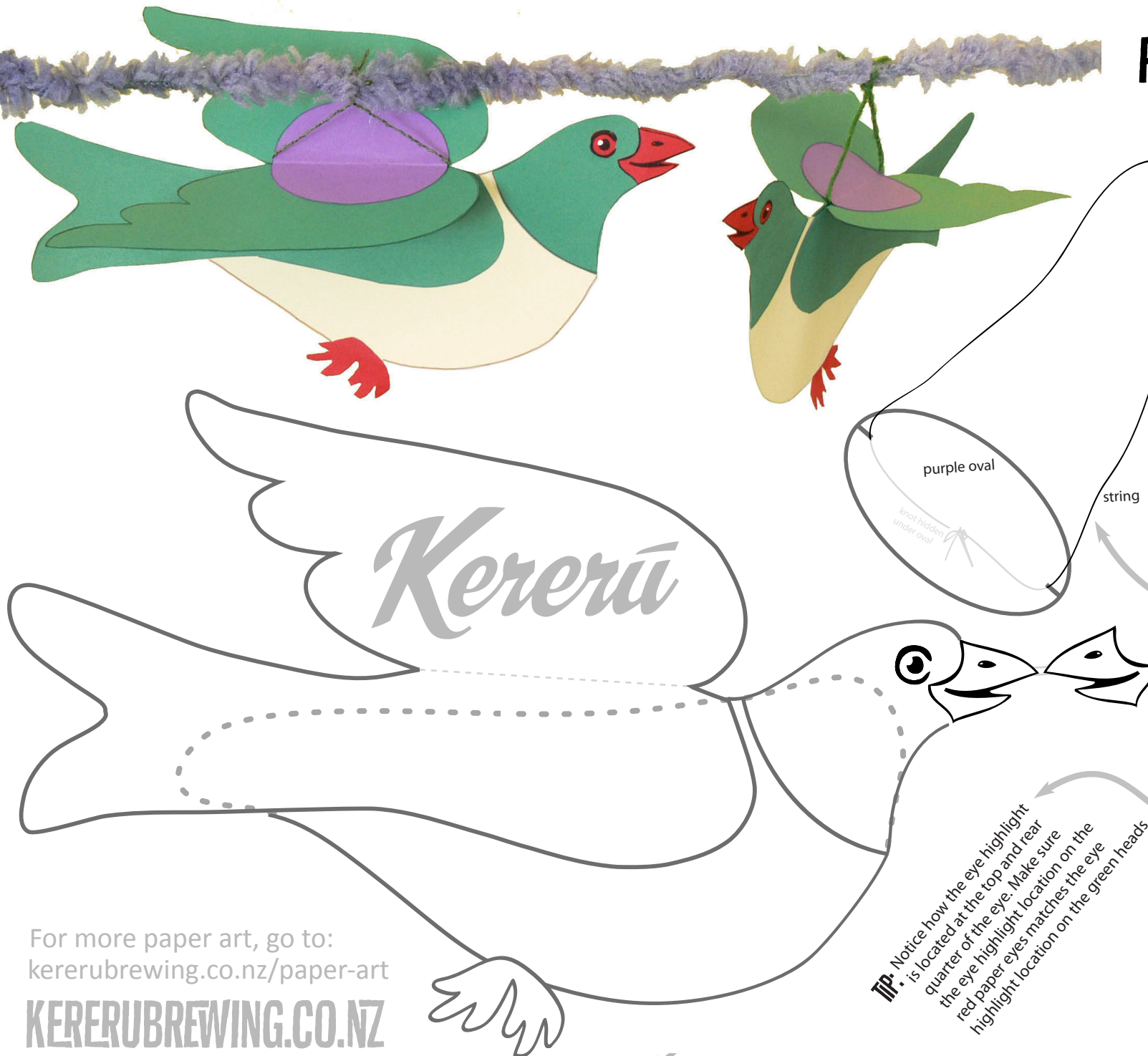
## (6) GLUE BEAKS, EYES, & FEET:

Paint glue on one side of a green bird head in the area where the beak would go. Press the beak to the glue so it looks like the diagram above, with the beak twin hanging in the air. Paint glue on the back side of the beak twin, and fold it into place.

Paint glue on red eyes and press into place on the green bird heads. Paint a tiny bit of glue on the top of the doubled bird feet and press into place.

## (7) GLUE PURPLE OVAL & STRING LOOP:

Place string loop in the notches on the purple oval, cover knot & paper with glue, and press oval to the bird's green back between the folded-down wings. Let dry.
